Short Vowels

If a word or syllable has only one vowel that comes at the beginning (VC) or between two consonants (CVC), the vowel usually stands for the **short vowel sound**.

Example Words

crop plan lunch problem sprint

Week Two

Long Vowels

When a word or syllable has a vowel followed by a consonant and the letter e (VCe), the vowel usually has a **long sound** and the e is silent.

Example Words

spoke invite price rule life

Week Three

More Long a and Long e Spellings

Along with what we learned about with the VCe spelling pattern, there are other ways that you may see the long a and long e sounds spelled in words

> Long $a \rightarrow ai$, ay, eaLong $e \rightarrow ea$, ee, ie, e

Long a maid great

Long e free shield
