Three-Letter Blends

Three-letter blends are made up of three consonants that are not separated by any vowels. When sounding out these blends, it is important to think of the sound of each letter before putting them all together.

Example Words

split
scram
strand
squash

Week Two

Words with /j/, /k/, and /kw/

There are multiple ways to spell the **sounds /j/, /k/, and /kw/**. These spellings can be found below:

/j/ → ge, dge
/k/ → c
/kw/ → qu

/j/
germ, judge
/k/
cake, coach
/kw/
quack, quote

Week Three

Silent Letters

Consonant digraphs are combinations of two consonants that make one sound. Some consonant digraphs include silent letters. These include:

kn-, wr-, gn-, -mb, and -rh

Example Words

knot
wrap
gnat
rhyme
limb
