## Vowel + /r/ Sounds

In a word, if the letter $r$ follows a vowel sound, the vowel sound will be affected! This is the case for all vowels. When you see a vowel followed by the letter $r$, you can call it an r-controlled vowel.

## Example Words

park
burn
firm teacher forest

## Week Two

Vowel + /r/ Sounds: er, ir, ur, or
We will continue to explore words that have a vowel followed by the letter $r$ but focus on er, ir, ur, and or when it follows a w (wor). Each of these make the same sound as you hear from the ur in nurse.

Example Words
burn
firm
teacher
work
jerk

## Vowel + /r/ Sounds in air and fear

This week, we are focusing on words with vowel + /r/ spelling patterns as they are in the words air and fear.

Spellings as in air $\rightarrow$ air, are, ear, ere Spellings as in fear $\rightarrow$ ear, ere, eer, eir, ier
