Compound Words & Abbreviations

This week, we are going to be looking at both compound words and abbreviations. A compound word is made of two smaller words while abbreviations are the shortened form of a word. Abbreviations can often be seen because they start with a capital letter and end with a period.

Example Words

airplane birthday anyone

> Mr. Dr.

Week Two

Irregular Plurals

In week two, we are going to be looking at **irregular plurals**. Most plurals are formed by adding -s or -es, but irregular plurals are formed differently.

Example Words

leaf → leaves knife → knives wolf → wolves goose → geese woman → women fish → fish

moose → moose

Week Three

Words with oo, ew, ue, ou

This week, we are going to be looking at Words with oo, ew, ue, ou as they sound in words such as hoop and hook.

Example Words

mood wooden drew smooth true you hooves
